#### **BATTLEGROUND SURVEY: METHODOLOGY**

Democracy Corps conducted a web survey with 2,500 voters from Nov. 5-11, 2023 in the presidential, House seats and US Senate battlegrounds for the 2024 general election. The oversample data are statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, age, and gender composition reflects that of projected 2024 general election voters in the collective battleground.

The sample used voter file data for proportions on race, age, and gender, along with 2020 CNN exit polling data to ensure that difficult-to-reach conservative subgroups by race, gender, and education were properly represented. And it weighted the cultural thermometers (NRA and pro-life groups), to offset the bias of on-line panels.

#### The total sample of 2,500 Registered Voters (1,000 Weighted) includes:

- 1,534 Registered Voters in Presidential Battleground States (685 Weighted)
- 1,194 Registered Voters in Senate Battleground States (553 Weighted)
- > 533 Registered Voters in Congressional Battleground Districts (188 Weighted)
- > 742 White Voters (750 Weighted)
- 633 Black/African-American Voters (120 Weighted)
- > 574 Hispanic/Latino Voters (80 Weighted)
- > 511 Asian American (Asian) Voters (30 Weighted)

### **Key findings**

- President Biden trails Donald Trump by 5 points in the battleground states and loses at least another point when we include the independent candidates who get 17 percent of the vote.
- Biden is trying to win these states where three quarters believe country is on the wrong track and 48 percent say, "I will never vote for Biden."
- Biden can win. Partisan polarization, abortion, and Trump threat is a dangerous strategy when the base of Blacks, Hispanics, Asians, LGBTQ+ community, Gen Z, millennials, unmarried and college women give Trump higher approval ratings than Biden.
- Congressional Democrats enter the election year in a more competitive position than the Biden-Trump contest.
- All Democratic campaigns need to understand voter anger and disappointment.
- 76 percent believe the country is headed in the wrong direction. They desperately want to change. Reciting accomplishments doesn't move them.

### **Key findings**


- Reasons voters think the country is off track?
- Inflation and the cost of living: 64 percent choose it as the top problem about 30 points higher than any other. The Biden presidency is defined by that inflation. This is only issue for Gen Z, millennials, unmarried women, & white working- class voters under 50.
- Democrats talking about this strong economy and things moving in the right direction sounds like you are talking about a different country.
- Black, Hispanics and Asian voters put crime, homelessness and violence as their second worry.
   Democratic erosion is multi-faceted.
- Trump and Republicans get higher ratings on wages staying ahead of prices, handling crime and the border. Many in Democratic base support Trump's policy pronouncements.
- The Trump-led polarization and success in defining Biden and Democrats means for many that a Biden victory will bring open borders allowing America to be infested with impoverished migrants and drug dealers, creating violent cities with more homelessness and crime.

### **Key findings**

- A Trump victory signifies for large pluralities chaos, violence, emboldened white nationalists, and the loss of democracy.
- "Dual haters" are a third of the electorate. One in ten say they won't vote for either Trump or Biden. This increases third party voting.
- President Biden and the Democrats need to to show who they are fighting for, talk about the pain of rising prices and highlight their efforts to address economic hardship( reducing drug costs, Child Tax Credit).
- The strongest narrative: shifting economic power away from the big corporations to workers.
   The most popular policy is raising their taxes.
- A powerful message that creates a future choice that contrasts Biden and the Democrats
  helping with family costs, creating jobs, protecting Social Security and securing abortion
  versus Republicans blocking help for families, threatening Social Security, and siding with the
  biggest corporations leads to a 12- point margin for Biden.

# If Trump re-elected, voters first fear chaos, white nationalist violence & an autocrat. Then, trickle down & abortion illegal



# If Biden wins, even more voters see open borders, crime and homelessness; school indoctrination & corruption lower, but high; little worry about abortion






## Strongest Biden message attacks big corporations and emphasizing worker power






## **Closing Message**
